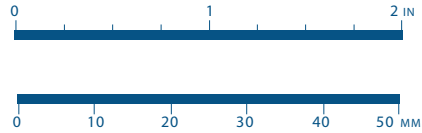


MEASUREMENT GUIDE FOR YOUR RING

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE?

- ▶ Before proceeding, use a ruler to confirm the size of the paper printed in the box on the right.
- ▶ Pull hard, the meter must fit perfectly to produce an accurate measurement.
- ▶ Measure your finger at the time of day when your hand is more exercised. This is usually at the end of the day.
- ▶ Avoid measuring your fingers when they are cold or moist, but will be thinner.
- ▶ Engagement rings and engagement rings over 5mm wide can fit tighter on your finger than rings of the same size but with a width of less than 5mm.

CONFIRM PRINTED PAPER SIZE



PLEASE READ CAREFULLY
Look at the top bar to make sure it is printed exactly 2 inches, or 50 mm long. If the length is not accurate, the ring measurement will not be taken.

OPTION 1

CREATE YOUR OWN RING

1. Trim the measurement of rings.
2. Wrap the ring gauge comfortably around the widest part of the intended finger, so that the numbers are visible to you and insert the tip through the slit you have made into the gauge.
3. Note the number that lines up with the slot, this is your ring size. Note that room sizes are also available if your meter indicates that it is between one-half and one-half sizes.

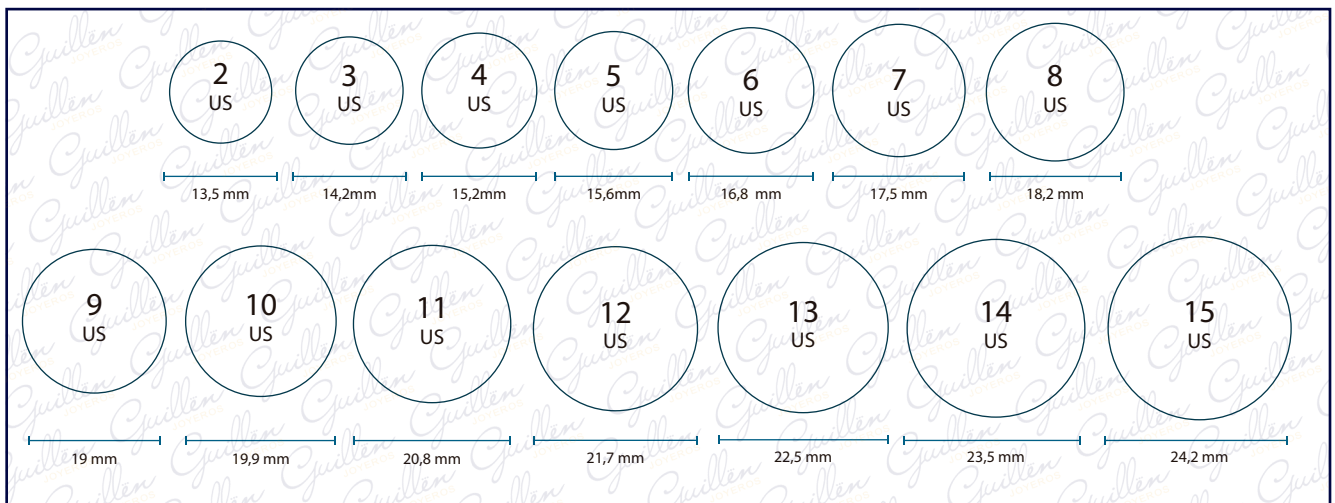
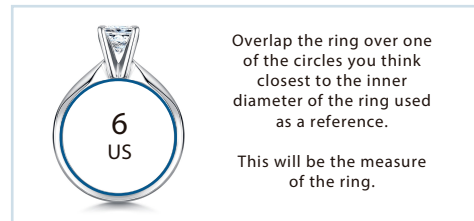


We advise plasticizing or coating of adhesive tape for greater resistance of the paper

OPTION 2

MEASURING A RING QUICKLY

1. Choose a ring that fits properly on the desired finger (the engagement ring and wedding ring are worn on the left-hand ring finger).
2. Place the ring over each of the circles shown in the lower chart until the inner silhouette of the ring fits the most accurate way.
3. If the ring is between two measures, its measurement will be that of the medium sizes.
